Discussion on Hall Allocation Policy

The President, Student Gymkhana presented the Hall Allocation Policy with the following changes

- The number of Mtech's were reduced from 139 to 87 and 65 MBA were added in Hall 7.
- The number of Mtech's were increased to 103 in Hall 4.

There were some concerns raised by the Hall representatives. They were as follows.

- Hall 1 representative raised a concern that why are the y9 dual batch being broken into 2 parts instead of y10 in 3 parts. The President, Student Gymkhana said that if some of the Hall 10 students agreed to stay in their own hall then this can be done.
- A resident of Hall 7 specifically demanded more Phd's from the science stream.
- A Phd resident of Hall 7 disagreed with the president of Hall 7 that the Mtech's don't create problems.
- On the point to put more science stream students in Hall 7, a General Body member said that this type of demarcation between science and engineering students has never been made.
- Any of the hall could not make any reasonable argument so the HAP-1 was passed.
- GH2 representative raised the concern that Phd's do not want to move to GH tower and instead u12 and y13 move to GH Tower.
- GH1 representative said that sending y12 to GH Tower will weaken their HEC as most of the HEC members are from y12.
- GH2 representative raised the concern of GH2 being demolished and asked the President to find out the exact details of the same.
- The Convener, student senate assured the GH2 representative that any movement of GH2 will not be done without being discussed on the floor of COSHA and the senate.
- A resident of Hall 4 raised the concern that why no new Phd were coming in Hall 4 in HAP-2 when they were coming in HAP-1.
- Due to lack of reasoning from Hall 7 and hall 4 members, no changes were made in the HAP-2 and the boys policy was passed by the consensus of the COSHA.
- Due to lack of information on the demolishing of GH2, no decision could be taken on GH policy.
