The Cell

Summary:

The Community Welfare Cell (CWC) works for a campus 'community' which extends not only to the student and the faculty members, but also to the staff members of the campus, the workers and their families, and any and all individuals who are related to the campus.

The Cell currently has six wings under it:

1. **Pragati**, working in the field of rural, social innovations to achieve equality in development.
2. **Prakriti**, working in the field of environmental awareness and impact assessment to achieve equality in terms of sustainability.
3. **Prayas**, working in the field of education for the marginalized sections of the society to achieve equality in educational opportunities.
4. **Raktarpan**, working to combat blood shortage in order to achieve equality in proper healthcare facilities.
5. **Unmukt**, working to address the gender and sexual diversity in the community and to achieve equality against discrimination.
6. **Vivekananda Samiti**, working to spread the message of Swami Vivekananda among the campus residents, and helping the entire community tackle its problems through motivation and inspiration.

The task before the Cell this year was to come up with a set of principles of work, establish a working structure, establish communication with the community and set up interactions within the wings.

We have made substantial progress on all of these counts. The structure of the Cell is a set of co-ordinated group of collectives, which are in themselves a set of co-ordinated volunteers working in specific directions. We continuously try to integrate various activities under the Cell and work as a cohesive unit.

We have also been active in presenting ourselves to the community through various digital and physical fora available to us, and constituting a culture of discussion in all our wings to allow critical assessment of our own work.

Activities:

1. **What is Merit:**
February 5, 2017

We collaborated with the Debating Society, Cultural Council, and organized an open discussion on what constitutes merit. We are looking at the issue from a caste angle.

We are planning follow-up sessions soon.

2. **Blog:**

We have an up and running blog which has an account of our activities and discussions. The blog is slowly growing, and shall cover all wings' activities soon.

3. **Facebook page:**

We have a Facebook page dedicated to the issues that we are working upon, and the issues that the campus faces.

Pragati

Regular Activities:

1. Discussion Sessions:

Before we implement solutions, we need to come up with structures of analysis. To allow us to understand issues, we hold regular discussion sessions, usually one per week. We explore topics related to technology and its incorporation into class politics.

The Cell's blog shares all these discussions. We try to incorporate what we learn in our activities with the campus.

2. Case Studies:

The problems that we work upon require much study and analysis. We are working on two issues presently: education and issues of people in servant quarters.

The problems require us to perform case studies into these groups.

3. Summer Project: May 2016 – July 2016

We oversaw a summer project on waste disposal systems in IIT Kanpur in the summers. The project had students analyzing the systems already in place in several key areas on campus and the strategies to improve them.

Sessions and Fora:

1. **Social Entrepreneurship- A road map to impact a million lives. (A career path ahead)**

November 4, 2016

We had a talk on social entrepreneurship by Mr. Sandeep Khare, Secretary of Vigyan Foundation. We discussed the need for social entrepreneurship, the failures of the government to provide basic services, and the steps to tackle these issues.

2. **Innovation in Education:**

November 6, 2016

We had a session on flipped classrooms and MOOCs in the campus, and its relevance to the student population.

3. **Campus for the Differently Abled:**

February 8, 2017

We conducted a discussion session with Prof. Kamle on the issues faced by differently abled people on campus. We identified several key problems and drafted a proposal which addressed these issues. The proposal has been submitted to the institute administration, and shall be taken up by the Cell newly created for this purpose.

4. **Pragati Web-Forum:**

With Programming Club's support, we now have a web forum for Pragati, which will be made available to the campus population soon.

Upcoming Events:

1. Open Meet:

We plan to host a few open meets on the issues faced by differently-abled people. The plans for this have been finalized and we have begun working along these lines.

2. Reports:

We are compiling reports on the case studies that we are performing. We shall publish it in a couple of months.

Prayas

Regular Events:

1. **English Learning Workshop:**
May – June 2016

We conducted our regular English classes for the students in the summers. We focused on reading and writing skills. We had different divisions among the kids, and attempted a structured format.

The workshop was a six-week long initiative and it concluded in a vacation for the kids.

2. **Prayas Premier League (PPL):**
May 30 – June 11, 2016

PPL is an annual cricket league for Prayas students. We organize the event every year to help children learn teamwork, accountability, dedication and leadership.

The event saw participation from around ten volunteers and ninety students. We structured 15 matches among 5 teams, and emulated the IPL structure and rules.

3. **Annual Function '16:**
September 25, 2016

Prayas organized the 15th annual function in the winter semester. The theme this year was Outgroup and Giving Back, which focused on marginalized sections of the society.

The function saw the combined efforts of Apna Skool and Prayas students. There were dance, drama and music presentations. The children prepared for these events for over a week. We also created a backdrop for the occasion.

The function had as its audience the parents of the kids, members from the student community, and the faculty.

4. **Prayas Entrance Test '17:**
March 2017

We are presently planning our entrance test, which shall be organized soon.

Supporting Activities:

1. Donation Drive: May – June, 2016

We organized a collection drive for items such as used bicycles, blankets and mattresses. We forward these donations to organizations or families which need these.

A separate 'Knowledge Bucket Challenge' in this period. We requested the campus to donate old books and/or board games of various kinds.

The drive saw significant donations in all spheres.

2. Broadening the Target Audience:

We also cater to a few students who lie outside Class 3 to Class 12.

We mentored one girl who is a school dropout. Four months later, a school agreed to admit her in their regular classes.

We also started guiding two girls pursuing B.Sc. in Biology in their 2nd and 3rd years. We also taught English to two college girls who needed exposure in the language.

We are planning to explore new target audiences in this manner.

3. Prayas Scholarship:

There are students in the graduating batch in Prayas who are unable to afford higher education. We have an alumni fund for this purpose with the DoRA.

We have almost drafted our proposal for availing the funds. The scholarship program can begin this year.

The current plan will address the problems of 15 students after a comprehensive survey of their conditions. The plan will be available on request once we construct it.

4. Prayas Website:

We have almost designed a new website for Prayas. It shall be up and running soon.

5. Resource Handling:

We generated extensive resources as test papers and syllabi for different classes, which will help us in structuring our classes.

Competitions and Sessions:

1. **VN Kulkarni Scholarship:**
April, 2016

Students of classes 5, 8 and 10 appeared in the V. N. Kulkarni Scholarship exam. This was conducted by Shiksha Sopan.

2. **GK Competition:**
February 11, 2017

Some students of classes 6, 7 and 8 also participated in a GK competition conducted by Swami Vivekananda Vidyalaya, Lodhar.

3. **HOPE:**
October 7, 2016

We organized a poster-making competition with Techkriti. The competition was named HOPE. Prayas hosted the event and the neighboring organizations Opportunity School, Jan Chetna Kala Manch, Swami Vivekananda Vidyalaya(Lodhar),and Apna Skool participated.

4. **Science Exhibition:**
July 8, 2016

To inculcate scientific temper among the children, we organized a science exhibition. Children displayed their curiosities in science by applying them in everyday tasks. More than 30 kids of different age groups performed these experiments.

We had invited the entire campus community to the event, and a lot of people turned up.

5. **Yoga Session:**
October 14 – October 16, 2016

We organized a three day yoga and meditation session among the students of Prayas and Swami Vivekananda Vidyalaya(Lodhar) with the help of 'Art Excel' team. The aim was to teach the children the benefits of having good health.

We discussed the importance of yoga in our daily life. The kids were also taught yoga exercises which they could practice at their homes. We plan to repeat this next semester.

6. **Gender Sessions:**

We organized sessions on gender to promote sensitivity among volunteers and children. These sessions were organized in collaboration with Unmukt.

The sessions covered the topics of identity, stereotypes, body, menstruation and harassment. We plan to conduct such sessions in the upcoming semesters in collaboration

with Unmukt.

7. **Recycled Poster-Making:**

We conducted a short session on reusing recycled posters. The children made various charts and posters on themes of demonetization, pollution and technology. These were then displayed on our bulletin board.

8. **Awareness Sessions:**

We had an Earth awareness session from January 25 to January 31, 2017. We commemorated Savitribai Phule on January 3, 2017 and discussed caste and gender in relation to education. We observed Rashtriya Ekta Diwas November 5, 2016. We are planning to do another string of the awareness sessions next term.

9. **Apna Skool Annual Function:
May 2, 2016**

Kids from Prayas participated in the annual function organized by Apna Ghar. The venue for the event was in Tatiyaganj. About 20 kids participated in this event and performed in group/solo dance and musicals. Their performance received much appreciation.

Celebrations:

1. **Eid Celebration:**
July 9, 2016

In our Eid celebrations last year, we discussed the teachings of Islam and the relevance of Eid. This event concluded with sweets distribution. We revived this celebration this year, and we will continue this in upcoming sessions too.

2. **Independence Day:**
August 15, 2016

On Independence Day, the volunteers as well as the kids presented poems and songs in the regular assembly. We also observe this day as the 'Karma Diwas' in Prayas -- a day to celebrate one's work. We had sweet distribution after this event too.

The kids were also invited to lead the oath-taking by the IIT student community.

3. **Rakhi Celebration:**
August 18, 2016

We celebrated Rakhi enthusiastically last year. The ceremony was simple -- tying of rakhis and sweet distribution.

4. **Diwali Celebrations:**
October 28, 2016

We celebrated Diwali by decorating the OAT with candles and *diyas*. We also made *Rangolis*. This event concluded with an aarti and sweets distribution.

5. **New Year and Christmas Celebrations:**
January 3, 2017

During our New Year and Christmas celebrations, someone dressed up as Santa Claus and distributed gifts. This was further accompanied by snacks distribution.

We talked about our New Year resolutions and planned the year ahead in Prayas.

6. **Prayas Picnic:**
January 15, 2017

We organized a picnic to Sobhan Sarkar towards the beginning of this year. We played different games and explored the place. We participated in various informal events there.

7. **Republic Day:**
January 26, 2017

We celebrated Republic Day with great zeal as it also marks our 'birthday'. We screened a documentary on the Indian constitution. We then cut a cake and distributed snacks.

Regular Events:

1. Discussion Sessions:

Our functioning as an awareness group requires us to keep challenging our ideas. To allow volunteer learning, we hold regular discussion sessions, usually one per week. We explore topics related to gender and sexuality.

2. Minute Meets:

We engage with the campus population through our interview series. We call it the Minute Meets, and the format is a text-based or audio podcast. We have picked up Antaragni and 'women in science' as our current themes.

The Minute Meets will be released in March through our Facebook page and blog.

Competitions and Sessions:

1. **Talk Gender:**
July 28 - August 11, 2016

This competition was modeled along the Tiny Tales format, and invited entries from the campus population. We saw various entries which were published through our blog on the page.

2. **Un/Acceptable:**
October 1, 2016

We collaborated with the English Literary Society to host a Poetry Slam. The theme for the event was gender stereotypes in relationships. We discussed the types of relationships that are allowed in the society and the types that are not.

The session saw many poems, which have been shared through our digital spaces. We plan to conduct such events in the future too.

3. **The Pink Campus:**
October 2, 2016

We collaborated with the Debating Society to host a discussion on sexism in IIT Kanpur. We saw a participation of over 50 people and we covered a lot of issues. The minutes for the meeting are available on our blog and are being shared through our page.

4. **Gender Sessions:**

We collaborated with Prayas to organize gender sessions for the children. The sessions covered the topics of identity, stereotypes, body, menstruation and harassment.

We plan to extend our reach to surrounding schools as well.

Upcoming Events:

3. Video Interviews:

We plan to host a few video interviews on specific issues in the campus. The plans for this series have been finalized and we have begun working along these lines.

4. Reports:

Vivekananda Samiti

Regular Activities:

1. Weekly Meditation Classes:

We conduct weekly meditation classes every Saturday from 10.00 am-11.00 am. Swami Amartyananda Maharaj from R.K.M. Kanpur conducts these sessions. The number of registered candidates for these sessions are about 50.

2. Sanskrit course:

Vivekananda Samiti and Rashtriya Samskrita Sanshthanam (राष्ट्रीय संस्कृत संस्थानम्), a deemed university under Government of India, conducts regular Sanskrit classes. We hold classes every Tuesday, from 6.15 pm - 8.15 pm, and Saturday, from 11.00 am - 1.00 am. The venue for these sessions are L8 and 105, New SAC respectively. The classes begun in November, 2016. Approximately 50 enthusiastic members from the campus community- faculty, students, staff and their family members – have registered for the Prathama and Dwitiya Dikshas of the course. Their attendance is fairly regular.

Our mode of teaching is interactive. We focus on daily conversations in Sanskrit and writing and reading simple constructions. The organization also provides the students with reference books. The course provides simple and rigorous exercise in communicating in Samaskritam. The instructor, Mr. Pradeep Semwal, has dedicated himself to the course. He is also ready to help students after the course hours. We shall award certificates (by राष्ट्रीय संस्कृत संस्थानम्) after completing this six-month long course.

Events under Gymkhana Funding:

1. Workshop on effective life management:

July 29 – July 31, 2016

We organized a three-day workshop on life management skills of IIT-K residents. The audience included students, faculty members and non-teaching staff. Hall workers, canteen workers and mess workers were also invited in this workshop.

Swami Amartyananda, Secretary of Ramkrishna Mission, Port Blair, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, delivered the workshop. There were three workshops, one on each of the following:

- a. The significance of spirituality in our present life (July 29)
- b. Role of the mind in reaching the goal of life (July 30)
- c. Methods to control the mind (July 31)

2. Lecture series on personality development:

August 20 – August 21, 2016

We organized a two-day lecture series on personality enhancement for IIT-K students. The talk also focused on purposeful living with yoga.

About 150 students participated in that lecture series. The lectures were delivered by Dr. O.P. Sharma, former Joint Director, Health and Medical Council, Government of Uttar Pradesh. We also acknowledge the support from Gaiytree Pariwar, IIT Kanpur.

3. Lecture series on Vedanta:

September 23 – September 25, 2016

Vedanta is ancient Indian literature which teaches us to question existence, the meaning of life and the significance of death.

We organized a three-day lecture series on Vedanta. Swami Narasimananda, editor of Vedant Keshari magazine delivered the lectures.

The title of these talks were:

- a. The Great Illusion (September 23)
- b. Mahavakyas of Upanishads (September 24)
- c. Tat twam asi (September 25)

The chief guest for this lecture series was Prof. Indranil Manna, Director, IIT Kanpur.

Events partly funded under Gymkhana:

Vivekananda Samiti has some funds in Gymkhana corpus account (donated by an alumni of 1986 batch). Some amount was taken as an advance after consulting with Dosa, President and other General secretaries which was utilized in Vivekananda Youth Leadership Convention 2017 and two health camps for underprivileged children studying in the primary school near IIT Gate. A detailed description is given below.

1. Vivekananda Youth leadership convention 2017 (VYLC): January 7 - January 12, 2017

VYLC-2017 was celebrated to mark the 155th birth anniversary of Swami Vivekananda. We organized various events like an open debate, workshops to enhance placement qualities of IIT-K students and talks on ancient Indian science and technology.

a. Open debate on “Demonetization may improve accountability”: January 7, 2017

We organized a session on demonetization because it was a relevant issue in January. We wanted to know the opinion of the campus on the issue. To investigate this, we organized an open debate on whether demonetization improved accountability. This was the first open debate on demonetization organized in IIT Kanpur.

Around 10 speakers participated in this event and the audience selected the winning team. The judges were Prof. Surajit Sinha (HOD-HSS Department, IIT Kanpur) and Prof. Anish Upadhyaya (HOD-MSE Department, IIT Kanpur).

Before the debate, 60% of the audience members voted for the motion while 40% voted against it. After the debate, 38% audience members voted for the motion while 62% voted against it. The debate was a grand success. About 250 audience members took part in the poll to decide the winners. Prof. Indranil Manna awarded the winners in the valedictory session on January 12.

b. Interactive talk on personality development: January 7, 2017 In this talk, Prof. Anish Upadhyaya motivated people through his interactive talk on personality development. We structured the talk around his experiences in life. He brought his experience as the HOD of a discipline to the stage. He discussed the steps which IIT graduates may follow for better placements and more fulfilling lives.

c. Is ancient Indian technology relevant today? January 7, 2017

Ancient Indian civilization has possessed great ideas: from techniques to find ultimate knowledge to efficient natural remedies for ailments. Modern India is progressing in the field of technology. At the same time, we harm our environment. We focused on the balance between progress and nature. Prof. D. P. Mishra, Department of Aerospace Engineering, IIT Kanpur, gave a talk on this topic.

d. Lecture on Seeds of Calculus in Ancient India

January 8, 2017

We call Newton the inventor of calculus. But there is evidence of calculus in ancient Indian mathematics too? We investigated this question in this talk. Prof. H.C. Verma delivered this talk.

e. Celebration of National Youth day 2017:

January 12, 2017

The youth is the backbone of a society. Swami Vivekananda dreamt of a society where the youth will be made up of muscles of iron and the nerves of steel. We observe Swamiji's birthday, January 12, as National Youth Day.

On January 12, 2017, we organized one workshop for the youth. We then distributed school accessories among underprivileged children studying in the Government Primary School near IIT gate. The details are:

i. Workshop on "Find a leader in you":

To tap the leadership that is hidden within a person, we organized a workshop on leadership. It included interactive games to enhance one's leadership skills and help with placement interviews. Prof. Kantesh Balani was the instructor for the workshop.

Vivekananda Samiti identified some government primary schools near the campus having inadequate facilities. We invited the students of the Government Primary School near IIT gate and their guardians and teachers. They were given DESKIT, a product designed by an IIT Kanpur based start up. A student can use DESKIT as a school bag and as a writing desk.

2. Health camps organized (in collaboration with R.K.M. Hospital, Kanpur): February 5 and February 12, 2017

We organized health camps in collaboration with Ramkrishna Mission Charitable Hospital, Kanpur.

The camp included facilities for a general health checkup, an eye checkup and a dental checkup for underprivileged students, their guardians and other people on February 5 and 12, 2017 in the Government Primary School at IIT gate. About 600 patients were treated in the two health camps. All doctors were from Ramkrishna Mission charitable hospital, Kanpur. We referred the patients to visit R.K.M. Hospital for further consultation free of cost.

The expenditure for this came from the Gymkhana corpus account. A part of the expenditure will also come from the regular Gymkhana budget for Vivekananda Samiti.

Other Activities:

1. The members of Vivekananda Samiti took a pivotal role in designing the **NPTEL MOOC: Course on Introduction to Ancient Indian Technology**. The course is offered by Prof. D. P. Mishra.

Upcoming Activities:

We are planning the following events in upcoming months:

1. A cloth distribution drive in the adjoining areas of IIT Kanpur.
2. A few placement related talks for students sitting in their placement interviews.
3. A joint session with the Counselling Service for student counselling activities.
4. A complete workshop on entrepreneurship and management.
5. An eye surgery camp for the underprivileged population in and around the campus.
6. We will expand our Sanskrit course and try to reach out to more people.
7. We are also making a documentary on Vivekananda Samiti and its activities.

Regular Activities:

1. Blood Donation Camps:

We organized numerous blood donation camps this year. The dates and the number of donations received is shown in the table below.

2. Handling of Helpline requests:

We have an helpline number (8882-982-982) for handling blood donation requests. We put up posters this time to allow people outside the campus to receive our number. An approximate of 870 helpline requests were handled by us.

3. Awareness Sessions:

We organized awareness sessions this year. The details are shown in the table below.

New Initiatives:

1. We ensured proper mandatory checkups along with our blood donation camps. We also provided reports for the checkups.
2. We had paperless camps by initiating online form systems.
3. We helped four kids who were suffering from thalassemia.
4. We had a Component Separation Machine installed in the Blood Bank so that the components can be provided in place of whole blood. This move will make the Blood Bank self-sufficient for 2 months saving around 3000 lives.
5. We revived our helpline number. We also started My Donor Stories on Facebook to increase general awareness through social media.

Regular Activities:

1. **Cleanliness through the use of posters:**

We placed posters near various dustbins urging people to throw the garbage in the dustbin and not litter around.

2. **Biogas plant at IITK:**

We discussed the possible design and installation of a prototype of a biogas plant and later to productionise it. We were not able to make the biogas plant because of onset of winters. We will again try to make it during the summers.

3. **Survey of the waste disposal system at IITK:**

We did a survey of the solid waste disposal system at IITK in summers as a project, along with Pragati.

4. **Earthen pots for birds in Hall 3:**

We placed earthen pots in Hall-3 for animals and birds to drink water from it. It is filled regularly.

Ongoing activities:

1. Video documentary on the water supply chain and disposal at IITK:

We are creating a video documentary in which we will show from where and how we get water at IITK and the problems associated at IITK. We will also show the whole chain through which water goes through, from groundwater to disposal to treatment to regeneration.

2. Implement a system to collect and reuse papers at IITK:

We are trying to implement a system where paper could be reused at IITK. We are trying to talk to DoAA and other authorities and seeing how we can implement this.

3. Plans on conducting a bird-watching lecture and workshop at IITK:

We will first conduct a lecture, given by an expert on bird watching and then hold a workshop for the same.

4. Studying ways to reduce the electricity usage at IITK:

We are researching on ways by which we can reduce the electricity usage at IITK.

5. Digital Fora:

We are currently engaged on the digital platform through two for a: Facebook and Slack. We have reached out to the community through our Facebook page, and we conduct regular meetings through Slack.
