DRAFT TO THE UG MANUAL**

1.1	1.1	The M.Sc. (Int.) Programmes have been changed to BS and references to all programmes other than B.Tech /BS have been removed.	
1.2	1.2	It is recommended that the Core Curriculum Committee (CCC) shall not be a sub-committee anymore and its functions be discharged by the CDMC.	
2.0	2.0	The number of days in a semester for the duration of the End-Semester Examinations has been changed from “last 10 days” to “last 9 working days” of the semester.	
N/A	3.1.b)	The sub-clause regarding admission to B.Tech/ B.S. programmes via ICCR (Indian Council on Cultural Relations) has been removed. The subsequent sub-clauses of Clause 3.1 have been renumbered.	
N/A	4.1.a)	The sub-clause “ <b>Slow-paced Programme</b> ” has been removed from Clause 4.1, and all references to the programme have been removed.	
5.0	5.0	The course structure of the B.Tech/ B.S. programmes has been edited to emphasize the flexible nature of the programme  References to all programmes other than B.Tech/B.S. have been deleted	
5.1	5.1	The reference to “Registration Advisor” has been dropped  The registration process has been edited to reflect the “pre-registration” and “registration” system currently followed. The pre-registration has been specified as Part 1 of a two part registration process	

N/A	5.2	The Clause “ <b>Registration of a Deficient Student</b> ” has been removed. Subsequent Clauses in Section 5 have been renumbered.	
5.3	5.4	The last date to drop a course has been changed from “till 15 days after the mid-semester examination” to “up to 4 weeks prior to last date of classes”. The reference to making a student drop a course has been removed, and has been added to Clause 5.4 instead.	
5.4	N/A	The Clause “ <b>Cancellation of Registration in a Course</b> ” has been added.	
5.5	5.5	The Clause has been edited to reinterpret Academic Load in terms of the new Credit System. A reference has been added regarding registering in courses which are not counted towards the SPI/CPI, subject to a $\geq 8.5$ CPI criterion. Registration limit in such a case has been changed to 70 credits	
5.6	5.6	The deadline for announcement of the list of summer courses has been removed. Provision for dropping a course in the Summer Term “up to two weeks prior to the last day of classes” has been added.	
5.8	N/A	The Clause “ <b>Termination of Programme</b> ” has been added, regarding the termination of the programme of a student who fails to register by the last date of registration.	
6.1	6.1	The sub-clause 6.1.e) regarding “ <b>Teaching Assignments</b> ” has been removed as it is a purely administrative matter. The provision to informally audit courses, as per the reference regarding “ <b>Auditing of courses</b> ” has been removed.	

6.2.b)	6.2.b)	<p>Sub-clause 6.2.b) dealt with make-up for end-semester examinations. For mid-semester examinations the matter was at the discretion of the Instructor-in-charge.</p> <p>The guidance of the Senate is sought on whether a make-up should be held for mid-semester examinations or whether status quo should be maintained</p> <p>Deadline of submission of request for make-up examination in End Semester exams changed from 1 day after the exam to 2 days after the last scheduled examination</p>	
6.3	6.3	<p>The deadline for submission of grades, depending on the number of students in the course has been tabulated.</p> <p>A* and E grades have been included and explanations to these grades have been added as references.</p> <p>Sub-clauses 6.3.c) and 6.3.d) have been added to explain the S/X grades and the W grade respectively. Subsequent sub-clauses have been renumbered.</p>	
7.0	7.0	<p>The references have been edited as per the recommendations of the ARC and the decisions of the Senate, to reflect the removal of Warning and the change towards a credit based evaluation.</p>	
N/A	7.1	<p>The Clause “<b>Warning</b>” has been removed as per the decision of the Senate.</p>	
7.1	7.2	<p>The Clause “<b>Academic Probation</b>” has been edited as per the decisions of the Senate.</p>	
7.2	7.3	<p>Clause 7.2, only deals with termination of a student due to inadequate academic performance. The other ground for termination are covered in Clause 5.8, 8.4, 9.1 and 12.2</p>	
7.3	7.4	<p>A deadline for submitting the appeal till 12 months from the date of termination is introduced</p>	

8.2	8.2	<p>The “<b>Short Leave</b>” limit has been changed to working days instead of days.</p> <p>A reference has been added for Short Leave during the Summer Term.</p>	
8.3	8.3	<p>The reference “normally completed at a stretch” has been removed from the Clause</p>	
8.4	N/A	<p>The Clause “<b>Termination of Programme</b>” has been added, specifying the rules regarding termination due to prolonged leave of absence, missing the end-semester examination. The ‘and’ condition is broken into 2 explicit condition and a footnote is added</p>	
8.5	8.4	<p>As per sub-clause 8.5.a) the CPI cut-off has been changed from 8.0 to 7.0 and the condition for backlogs has been removed for Exchange programmes.</p> <p>The sub-clause 8.5.c) explicitly states that grades obtained at another institute will not be reflected on the transcript or the grade sheet of the student, and has been amended as per the new Credit System.</p>	
9.1	9.1	<p>The minimum residence duration for the BTech/BS program has be reduced to 7 semesters from 8 semesters, and all references to other programmes have been removed and shall be added at a later stage</p>	
9.2/9.3	9.2/9.3	<p>The Clauses, regarding dual degree programmes have been removed, and shall be entered as and when available.</p>	
9.4	9.4	<p>The graduation requirements have been appropriately modified as per relevant Senate decisions</p>	
9.5	9.5	<p>The reference regarding allowing student in a dual degree programme to exit with a single degree has been removed. This may be added again at a later stage.</p>	
12.2	12.2	<p>Changes in the manner in which the S-SAC recommendation is to be handled.</p> <p>Instructors &amp; Wardens are required to report any action taken to the DOAA &amp; DOSA respectively.</p>
